Oil Spill Prevention and Administration Fee: Rate Increase Effective July 1, 2025

Effective July 1, 2025, the Oil Spill Prevention and Administration (OSPA) fee will increase from \$0.094 per barrel to \$0.096 per barrel of crude oil, petroleum products, and renewable fuel.

Fee rate calculation

The Department of Fish and Wildlife is responsible for determining the OSPA fee rate each fiscal year based on the percentage change in the California Consumer Price Index.¹ The rate is effective July 1 through June 30 each year.

How the fee applies

Owners of crude oil, petroleum products, and renewable fuel must pay the OSPA fee. Marine terminal operators, refinery operators, renewable fuel receiving facility operators, and renewable fuel production facility operators are responsible for collecting the OSPA fee from the owner.
